What you, as a student, need to know about Stalking



## What Is It

Stalking is a pattern of coercive behavior that can include physical, psychological, sexual, economic, and emotional abuse, perpetrated by one person.

Stalking is engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for the person's safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress.

Course of conduct means two or more act in which stalker follows, monitor, observes, surveils, threatens, or communicates to or about a person.

## If You Are a Victim

If you are a victim of stalking; please tell someone! There are *free and confidential* resources for you. It is natural to feel scared and uncertain about the next steps.

## **The Consequences**

- Any stalking that takes place on campus will be handled through the school's disciplinary system.
